The Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen wishes to advise loyal Brookvale Holiday Resort customers that the lakeside campground portion of Osoyoos Lake Regional Park will be reverted back to park use in the fall of 2010 for residents and visitors.

Reason for Change



Osoyoos Lake Regional Park was granted to the Regional District by

Order in Council on April 23, 1981 from the Province of British Columbia. The land was granted for the purpose of a public park.

In the mid 1980s the Regional District entered into a Lease Agreement with Brookvale Holiday Resorts allowing use of a portion of the park as a commercial campground. In September of 2009 the Province noted the restriction on use for public park purposes only, as contained in the Crown grant, is not being adhered to by the Regional District.

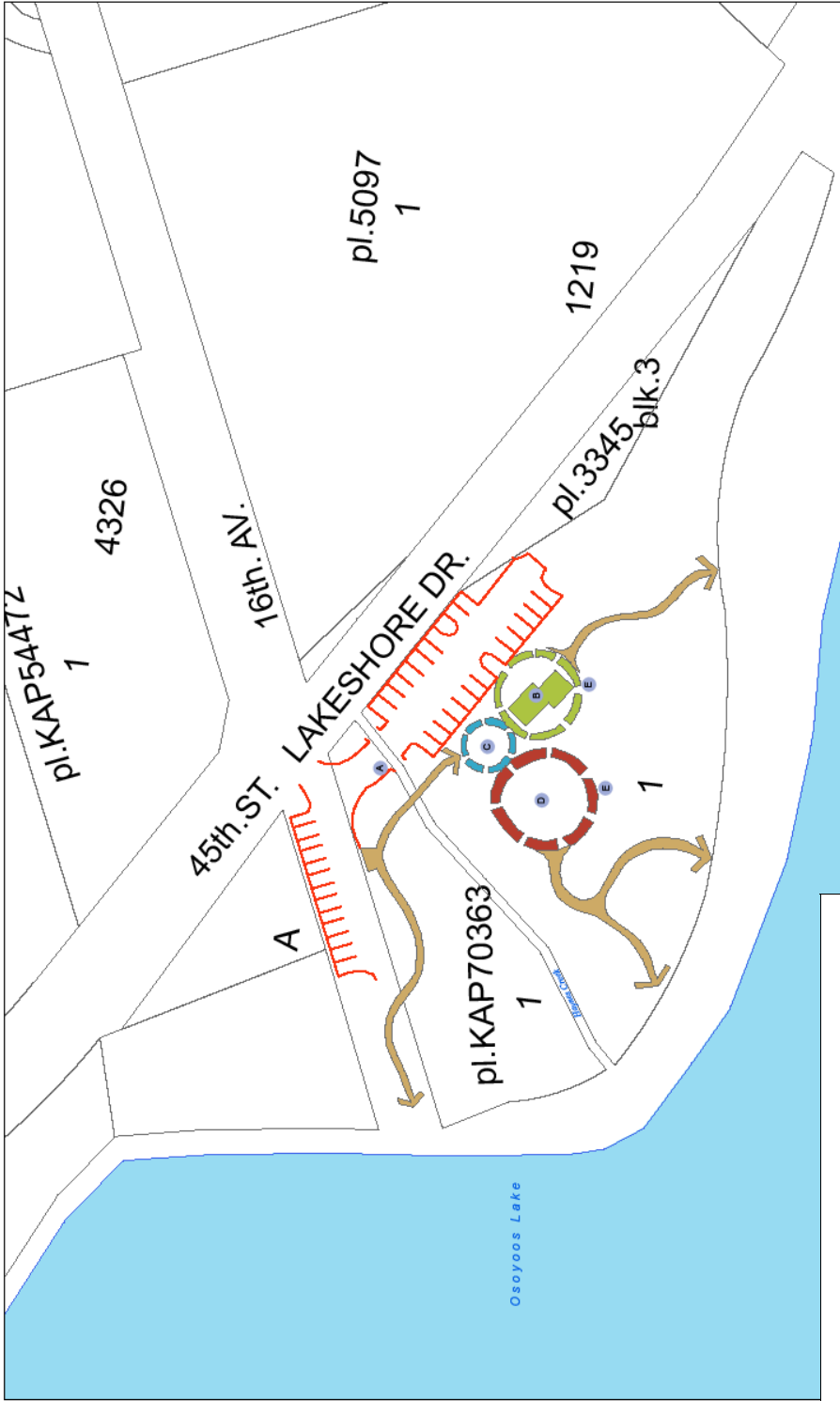
The Province has been advised that the Lease Agreement with Brookvale Holiday Resorts will not be renewed to meet the Order in Council directive and that extensive plans are being developed to facilitate an urban park. The Province is willing to accept continuation of the commercial use until October 2010 based on park improvement plans.
