



NOTICE TO ALL NARAMATA IRRIGATION CUSTOMERS

IRRIGATION TURN-OFF

The Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen Utilities crew will commence fall irrigation turn-off the week of:

October 24, 2022

Please take whatever precautions necessary to winterize your private systems.

While this notice targets those with separate irrigation connections, it is also a great time for homeowners to check their Pressure Reducing Valves (PRV's) inside their homes **and/or** on their irrigation systems in high pressure areas. Check if they are working correctly and replace them as needed.

- PRV's help to protect plumbing fixtures from damage or breaks that may cause wasteful leaks.
- Signs of high pressure can be:
 - ⇒ banging heard in pipes (water hammer), or
 - ⇒ Water spitting out of faucets, worn washers, and intermittent toilet 'hiss'
- Life expectancy for PRV's = about 10 years
