

Survey Results


- Combined on-line and exit surveys
- 111 surveys completed
- Focused on key new initiatives in draft Plan
 - Agree, Disagree, Unsure/Not Applicable
 - One open-ended question

Survey Results


- Generally a high degree of support for Plan's initiatives
- Exception: Household collection of food waste (57% of respondents supportive and 20% unsure)
- Comments:
 - Concern over increased cost
 - Concern with being overregulated
 - Want glass recycling to be curbside or easy to access

- Unsure about food waste collection, particularly re. "Bear Smart"
- Want more information on what can be recycled and where
- Garbage collection should be bi-weekly
- Want to recycle Styrofoam
- Curbside collection in Carmi is not wanted; concerns about bears.
- Good plan!



Open Houses

- Roughly 100 people attended
- Like survey, attendees indicated support for most of the proposed components of the Plan
- Exceptions:
 - At Penticton Meeting: Carmi residents opposed to curbside collection due to concern with attracting bears
 - At Keremeos Meeting:
 Residents concerned with cost of curbside collection



Open House Comments

- There should be better access to recycling in parks and at festivals
- A "last chance" location for reusable items should be available at the disposal sites
- "Styrofoam" (expanded polystyrene) should be added to the recycling system
- Interest in residential collection service using carts



Apex: Proposed Transfer Station and Recycling Depot

- Separate consultation process
 - RDOS staff met with Resort and Property Owners Association
 - Letter and survey sent to all property owners
- 127 surveys returned
 - 61% support for transfer station & recycling depot
 - Concern with cost
 - No consensus on how to pay for it





Area G:

Board direction given to include in the Plan: Investigate the costbenefit of having of a portion of Electoral Area "G" solid waste be sent to the Princeton Landfill (instead of sending all the waste to Campbell Mountain Landfill) prior to the next curbside collection contract.

• Carmi:

Recommend modifying this component of the Plan to include: Options for bear smart waste collection be assessed by the Bear Smart Coordinator and the community be engaged in developing solution prior to implementation of any curbside services.



Recycling of Styrofoam:

 Add to the Plan: Confer with Province regarding potential for Styrofoam to be covered under a future EPR program and assess the cost-benefit of inclusion in next curbside contract.

Glass recycling:

• Add to Plan: Explanation as to why glass is not accepted in the curbside program and that the RDOS will work with bottle depots to set up collection of non-deposit glass and glass will continue to be accepted at RDOS solid waste facilities.



- Recycling in Parks and At Festivals: Add into the Plan that the RDOS will work with parks departments and festival organizers to develop a best-practices approach to recycling and identify how the RDOS can further support recycling efforts in parks and at festivals.
- **Cart-based collection**: add to the Plan *that the RDOS* will assess the cost benefit of cart-based collection prior to next curbside collection contract.



• Reuse:

- Lots of interest in having a "free store" at their local disposal facility
 - The draft Plan states that these would only be set up in communities where no local reuse option is available
 - Option: Pilot a free store at one of the disposal sites
- Lots of interest in accessing used construction materials
 - Option: Set up salvage and resale operation at Okanagan Falls landfill
 - This is currently in the draft Plan as happening *only if* a private or non-profit operation doesn't come to fruition



• Food Waste Collection:

- Lower level of support than other plan initiatives
- No changes recommended
 - Food waste collection will not be required until composting capacity is in place (4-5 years)
 - Food waste collection becoming the new norm
 - Can take advantage of experience in other BC communities

Apex:

- 61% support (based on survey)
- No changes recommended
 - Garbage and recycling collection is appropriate

Recommendation to Board

 For consideration by the members of the advisory and steering committees:

That the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan, with the agreed upon revisions, be sent to the Minister of Environment for approval.
