An Evacuation Alert has been issued by the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen (RDOS), and Penticton Indian Band (PIB), because of the potential danger to life and health due to the threat of the Lower Blue Mountain Wildfire.





#### WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:

PIB community members can call 250-809-1895 for information.

RDOS residents can call 250-490-4225 for information.

- Determine as a household:
  - A meeting area outside the evacuation area
  - Who to stay with (friends or family)
  - Safest route to travel to your destination
- Pack essential items in one container (visit http://www.preparedbc.ca or FireSmart's Last Minute Checklist for more information):
  - Government IDs (Driver's Licence, BCID, Passport)
  - Medication and medical equipment, if portable
  - Important documents (e.g. insurance, banking and mortgage information)
  - Immediate care needs for children, seniors, pets, and those requiring additional assistance
  - Keepsakes and other valuables if time and space permits
- If you have serious health, mobility issues, or do not have access to transportation, consider evacuating now.
  - For assistance, please contact: PIB 250-809-1895 or RDOS -250-490-4225
- Pre-register for Emergency Support Services (ESS) at http://ess.gov.bc.ca. ESS is for people evacuated from their primary residence and normally provides up to 72 hours of support when alternatives cannot be accessed.
- Prepare to transport pets with all necessary support (kennels, on leash or in travel containers).
  - Pet owners and hobby farmers with concerns for their animals can contact: Animal Emergency Response Team (ALERT): 250-809-7152
  - Commercial farmers who require assistance can contact: 250-490-4225
- Relocate any recreation vehicles, boats, and trailers to a safe area or storage outside of the danger area.
- Secure your Fire Arms in accordance with Section 118 of the Firearms Act.
- Remove any hazardous materials in and around your property.
- Connect hoses and sprinklers to outdoor faucets / taps, but leave them turn off.
